Is FC Bayern Munich Killing Off Their Competition?




A Network Analysis of Transfer Expenses within the Bundesliga


Motivation

- FC Bayern Munich is the most dominant club in Bundesliga history
- the club is often criticized for stifling its competitors by buying out their key players
- this analysis aims to explore whether the data on transfer spending supports this claim

Approach

- Analysis of transfer expenses between Bundesliga clubs over a period of ten years
- network with clubs as vertices and transfer spending as edges
- Research Question: Does FC Bayern Munich strategically target direct competitors with disproportonately high transfer spendings?









A Closer Look

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- Bayern Munich spent roughly 40% of their total expenses on Dortmund players
- Bayern bought from less clubs than Dortmund, primarily from direct competitors (except Werder Bremen and VfB Stuttgart)
- both clubs had significantly higher expenses than revenues
 - = transfer expenses in m €
 - = transfer revenues in m €



Analysis

- between 2011/12 and 2020/21, Bayern Munich spent less money on Bundesliga players than Borussia Dortmund and VfL Wolfsburg
- Bayern spent more money on Dortmund players than any team on any other team's players
- remarkably, Dortmund spent almost twice as much money on Bundeliga players in total, buying mostly from direct competitors

Results

- it can be argued that Bayern Munich spent a noticably large part of its transfer expenses on players from competitor Dortmund - however, the money spent on players from other Bundesliga clubs does not seem to be unusually high compared to their competitors - overall, the fact that almost half of FC Bayern's transfer expenses went towards Dortmund might indicate strategic reasons

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
